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## Goals for Butler Middle School's CSIP 2017-2018

### Attendance Goal:

- 1) In the 2017-2018 school year, BMS will have 85% of our students on track by the end of the school year. We will reduce the percentage of students at some risk by 75% by the end of the school year. As a sub goal, we want to increase the percentage of Sp Ed students on track to 75% on track.

### Behaviors Goal:

- 1) At least 85% of our students will be on track with 0-1 major classroom disruptions per quarter during the 2017-2018 school year. We will reduce the numbers of tardies and class disruptions by 10% each quarter.

### Coursework: Grades Goal:

- 1) Course Work--Course Performance--Quarter Grades, GPA--We would like to see 80% of our students on track each quarter with at least 50% of our SP Ed and ELL students on track each quarter. Current Data—35% of students have 1 or more D/Fs and 28% are at risk in GPA.

### Coursework: SRI (Reading) Goal:

- 1) Course Work Reading--At least 80% of our students will be proficient or advanced on the Spring 2018 SRI. Additionally, at least 80% of our SpEd and ELLs will improve by at least 50 points or 1 level at each administration of the SRI during the 2017-2018 school year. Finally, each grade level will determine a specific grade level SRI goal to be determined from Fall 2017 SRI data.

2. **Approve last meeting minutes** (January): Cindy England motioned to approve the minutes from the January meeting. Doug Hallenbeck 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and all were in favor.

### **3. Review of BMS MTSS (Multi-Tiered Systems of Support) – Paula Logan**

- Paula reviewed the first draft of the new Multi-Tiered Support System. (see attached)
  - Each tier is multi-faceted; Academic and Behavior.
- Paula is working on a formalized form to share with parents for next school year.
  - Any suggestions/ideas are welcome.

### **4. 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Honors Updates – Paula Logan**

- There is not a NEW math curriculum, just a new math book.
  - Lisa Boyce is very pleased with the new math book, it is easier to teach from, a lot more hands on, the practice is much more meaningful and in-depth.
- There is not a separate state or district curriculum map for 6<sup>th</sup> grade honors class.
- We are looking to copy what Albion and a couple of other middle schools are doing for honors classes; each student will have the opportunity to receive honor on their report card/transcript.
  - This allows students that wish to take an honors class but have scheduling conflicts to have the opportunity to receive honors in the class.
  - If they don't take honors 1<sup>st</sup> term they can still opt in for the 2<sup>nd</sup> term and vice versa.
- Stacie Skelton made a motion to support the school's decision to move forward implementing the new honors program. Laura Rupper 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All in favor.

### **5. Report on Digital Citizenship Week/NetSmartz Assembly – Doug**

- To prepare for the week, there were discussions during Bruins Time the 1<sup>st</sup> week of February.
- The presenter was very impressed with our student body, said they were very respectful.

### **6. Review CSIP Data**

- As you look at the Behavior Goal, there are 2 graphs.
  - The first graph is the number of classroom disruptions reported each month.
  - The second graph gives us better data. It has been broken down further to show how many students have had only 1, 2+, and 10+ referrals each month.
    - This will give us a better idea of our repeat offenders.

### **7. Review of LandTrust Monies and plan for this year – See attached.**

- We made a change to the original plan, instead of hiring an intern counselor we hired a 35-hour aid to work with the students that are struggling.
  - Becca Fryer was hired for this position.
  - Students can drop an elective and be placed in one of her “study skills” classes
  - Currently she has 4 class periods of students she is working with.
- Paula would like to propose hiring a second 35-hour aid to assist Becca with these students.
  - Ily Murdock made the motion, Kami McMaster 2<sup>nd</sup> and the vote was unanimous.
- We have 2 computer labs that are outdated and need to be replace. The teachers would prefer mobile Chromebook labs rather than “fixed” labs. That way they can stay in their classroom with all of their supports.

## **8. Review of possible goals from Building Leadership Team/PD for next year**

- We would like to keep in line with the same attendance, behavior and coursework goals for next year.
  - As previously discussed regarding behavior, we would like to focus more on the classroom disruption data.

## **9. Professional Development Report**

- The district has put together a new Math Lab program for the 2018-19 school year.
  - Mrs. Schneggenburger currently teaches a 6/7 math lab class.
  - Next year we will “buy out” a prep period from Mrs. Clark (7<sup>th</sup> grade) as well as a prep period from one of the 8<sup>th</sup> grade teachers. They will teach every other day, a 7/8 Math Lab class.

## **11. Other:**

- Student Permits will be approved or denied this week. Denied permits will be placed on a waiting list.
  - We currently have 318 - 8<sup>th</sup> grades, 277 – 7<sup>th</sup> graders and 320 – 6<sup>th</sup> graders coming in next year.
  - We have 48 new permits, for the 2018-2019 school year, waiting approval.
    - 5 – 8<sup>th</sup> grader, 11 – 7<sup>th</sup> grade and 32 – 6<sup>th</sup> grade
- Student Walk Out protest. We had about 20 students that participated in the protest today.
