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Goals and Action Plans for Butler Middle School's CSIP 2016-2017

Literacy Performance Goals:

- 1) Increase our school-wide reading proficiency to 80% in the advanced and proficient ranges as measured by the SRI. 8th Grade 90%; 7th Grade 80%; 6th Grade 70%
- 2) ELA SAGE to show a MGP of 50% or growth of 5% in the ELA 2017 SAGE.

STEM Performance Goals:

- 1) Math SAGE to show a MGP of 60% or growth of 5% in the 2017 SAGE.
- 2) Science SAGE to show a MGP of 65% or growth of 5% in the 2017 SAGE.

PBIS Performance Goal:

- 1) Score of at least 80% on the TFI, measuring implementation and knowledge of school-wide PBIS plan.
 - 2) Collect and analyze Educators Handbook and Great Bruin Card data.

- **Co-Chair:** Doug Hallenbeck was nominated by Paula and 2nd by Lisa Devashrayee. Vote – All in favor.

4. Meeting Outline* for this year:

5. Review CSIP* for this year: (see attached)

- BLT (Building Leadership Team) & SCC come up with the goals...
- Identify problem/concerns and set goals based on the needs.

Expenditures:

- Talked with 2016-2017 SCC about an additional fundraiser for another chromebook lab.
- We received an eMints grant – 300 chromebooks... chromebooks are about \$150 each.
- All 7th graders will receive a chromebook. We will hold off on the fundraiser.
- PBIS: PTSA has given some money to help with the rewards and assemblies.

6. SAGE/School Grade and PACE*: (see attached)

- We went from an A to a B grade.
Under UTAH CODE 53A-1-1110 (2) *Notwithstanding Subsection (1), and subject to Subsection (3), for a school year in which at least 65% of schools described in Subsection (1)(a) or (b) receive an A or a B, the board shall increase an endpoint of a range described in Subsection (1)(a) or (b) by five percentage points over the previous school year.*

Due to the fact that 74% of Utah elementary schools received an A or B and 66% of High Schools received an A or B the above language takes effect and new percentages are now applied.

- PACE and School Grading use the SAGE info. In School Grading they drop the bottom 40%. PACE uses all data.
- Point Structure:
 - Growth: 200 points ...
 - Achievement: 300 points whole school
- ELA: to increase by 59%
- Math: to be at 68% this yr
- Science: to be at 65% or 68.5%

SAGE data results, compare schools in the state. Not tied to money for the school. Test scores do not effect teachers salary.
Small percent of students opt out in our school.
School growth up 12% this yr!

Growth for below students – huge improvement! 81 of 100 points

As a school we increased in EVERY area.

7. District Bussing/Transportation Discussion: Bell Efficiency Program (see attached)

This is looking at BUS EFFICIENCY ONLY not how it will affect teachers, students and families.

- Option 1: eliminates 21 busses \$360,000 saving in Annual operational cost.
 - This option BMS will start and end 5 min later.
- Option 2: eliminates 33 busses, savings of \$567,000
 - No change to BMS start or end time.
- There will be a survey asking for parent input. The Board will make the final decision.

8. Cell Tower Funding 2016-2017:

- We get about \$7,000 a yr.
- 4 areas the SCC approved the cell tower \$ to be used for.
