9. PTSA Advocacy

- Report of Legislative Officer Hilary
- Heather attended the PTA day at the Capitol
 - \$29 billion plus worth of volunteering hours in the State
 - \$64 Million distributed through Land Trust
 - Senate Bill 20 out of the Senate Equalization among Districts generating Tax. We would lose a lot of money to give to other lower districts.
 - Trying to get School Grading out Did pass to remove it.
- Stacie talked about Town Hall she attended. Only way to raise teachers salary is to raise taxes.

10. Other Misc. items

- Facebook page = Tatiana contacted Michael to get updated information. We can't switch it from Michael to someone else until someone with a Facebook account contacts him. He needs their account info, then he will switch Admin use of it.
- Cultural Fair that Council is doing Lois April 17th 6-8pm at Jordan HS
- Lois is working on getting the DLI to handle this responsibility for this year.

** While we were there a "Shelter in Place" alert was activated at the school. Someone called in a "bomb" threat to the front office. Police and district personnel were on top of it. By noon all was resolved. Per the announcement made to the students and teachers: "A current student thought it would be funny to prank call the school. The student was turned in by other students and the police were able to track the phone number used to place the call. All is fine and the Administration appreciated the quick responses to get to your classes and stay put."

SUMMARY OF MEMORY BOOK DISCUSSION

- -In February, posted a list of books already sold near Cafeteria. Promoted at GREAT Bruins Store & at PTC nights.
- -An additional 69 books were sold (about 20 at PTC others online). Current total books sold is 414.
- Will send out a Skylert and email from Principal to extend pre-sale price of \$25 to Friday. Then price increase to \$35. No credit card sales can be taken using Skyward after price increase.
- -We need books to be sold- profit is approximately \$8.78 per book at the pre-sale price of \$25. We would need to sell 729 to meet the Net Income amount on the Budget for this year.
- Additional discussion was held on options for pre-sale orders vs. "day of event" sales. No final decisions made on what to do.
- Sentiment was that "day of event" sales cannot be avoided and we want every student who wants a book to be able to get one, if possible. Increased price on books purchased by PTSA for "day of" sale should offset cost of any unsold books. In the past, 100 extra books have been purchased by PTSA.
- Increased prices were discussed, but not finalized. Perhaps an increase to \$40 or \$45 close to the date we submit order to Lifetouch. Most agreed that \$50 for "day of" sales was not too much.
